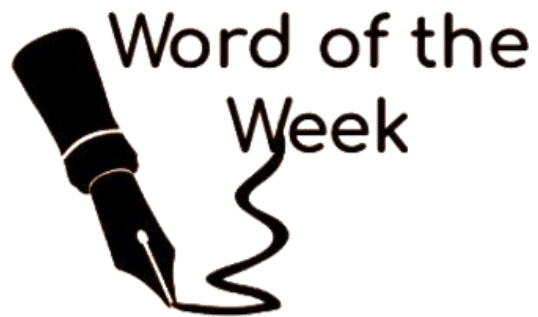
- I absolutely abhor cruelty to animals and believe everyone should treat pets kindly.

Etymology:

The word "abhor" comes from the Latin verb "abhorrēre", which means "to shrink back from" or "to shudder at."

It is made up of two parts:

"ab-" meaning "away from"

"horrēre" meaning "to shudder" or "to bristle" (related to fear or disgust)
