- Before buying the insurance, make sure you understand the policy terms.

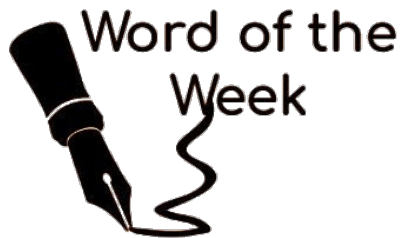

Example Policy: The New Plastic Packaging Tax (launched April 2022)
